Message from the Director

I am excited to share the annual report of BTST Cares Inc. because it is a reminder that I have the amazing responsibility to build the capacity of this nonprofit with a team that thinks it not robbery to uplift others.

This year, we were able to secure new donors, partners and volunteers, including Blk Swan, Self-ish Beauty, Saks Fifth Avenue, and the Mayor's Office of Neighborhood Safety and Engagement. One partnership that stands out particularly is that with Harlem Park Elementary Middle School under the very capable leadership of Principal Venus Jackson. Through this partnership, BTST Cares partnered to present a 15 session Parent Bootcamp, install a mural on the playground (inspired by Harlem Park's student body and curated by Baltimore artist Kid Balloon), and host a summer camp. These programs engaged the entire Harlem Park community, including the school's faculty and staff. Additionally, we hosted with Blk Swan restaurant, what will now be an annual Juneteenth symposium.

It was an award-winning year for BTST Cares as we were recognized by both the Mayor's office and Philanthropik for the services we provide the community. Though our goal is not to be touted for the work that we do, it is humbling and exciting to be recognized by Baltimore's Mayor, the Greater Baltimore Committee, the Baltimore Community Foundation, and others in the philanthropic community.

We, at BTST Cares, are deeply indebted to the leadership and staff at BTST Services LLC. They are our largest contributors both in funding and volunteer time. This year, we started a workplace giving program and I am pleased to say that many of the staff members contributed to ensure we meet the emergency needs and provide the ultimate Thanksgiving and Christmas experience for our clients.

Though we still are dealing with the real time and residual effects of a worldwide pandemic, we at BTST Cares, stand with conviction to deliver quality programs and services through a lens of

health equity. Though we witness daily examples of racial injustice and inequity, our Board and staff are committed to facing those obstacles head on and providing the tools for success to those who are most vulnerable and, there is more work to be done.

At a time when so many others had to step back, BTST Cares stepped forward: creating spaces for growth and healing, educating communities, and supporting those in need.

Highlights & Milestones

Here's how we did it.

- 1. Art That Empowers Mural Installation
 - a. Completed at Harlem Park Elementary/Middle School (HPEMS) in May 2021.
- 2. Juneteenth Symposium
 - a. An inaugural celebration of Blackness offered in partnership with BLK Swan. This year's conversation was moderated by White House correspondent and CNN Political Analyst April Ryan and included leaders from various fields who spoke about the progression of African Americans post-slavery, mental health in Black community, the importance of Blacks in business, and much more. Featured panelists included D. Watkins, Aaron Maybin, Chris Simon, Lamarr Shields, Jada McCray, Joshua Harris, and Jan Desper Peters.
- 3. A Better Tomorrow Boot Camp
 - a. A 5-week virtual coaching program on the principles of social emotional learning (SEL).
- 4. Human Trafficking in the 21st Century
 - a. Trained 44 therapists and counselors on how to serve human trafficking survivors.

- 5. B-More Aware
 - a. Trained 20 community leaders to recognize the signs of human trafficking.
- 6. HPEMS Summer Program
 - a. Provided an academic remediation and summer enrichment program for 38 students.
- 7. Back to School Drive
 - a. Annual program for K-12 clients of BTST Services. 94 students served.
- 8. Coppin State Partnership
 - a. Trained 896 behavioral health professionals on best practices of trauma-informed care and medication-assisted treatment.
- 9. Let's Give Thanks Drive
 - a. Annual Thanksgiving meal giveaway for clients of BTST Services.
- 10. The Big Give Back
 - a. Annual holiday toy drive and gift reveal for clients of BTST Services.
- 11. Mayor's Business Recognition Award
 - a. Recognized by the Greater Baltimore Committee & Baltimore Development Corporation for our work on the Fayette Street Black Lives Matter Mural.
- 12. 2021 Philanthropik COVID-19 Community Partner
 - a. Recognized for our commitment to mental health during the COVID-19 pandemic.

Priority Goal and Target #1: To create opportunities for social, emotional, and financial growth.

BTST Cares is dedicated to the holistic well-being of our communities. We partnered with Harlem Park Elementary/Middle School to offer programs centered on <u>social emotional learning</u> (SEL) principles for over 50 parents and students.

Priority Goal and Target #2: To provide community programs through a lens of health equity. Health equity means everyone has a fair and just opportunity to be as healthy as possible.

BTST Cares partnered with Dr. Kimberly Gordon-Achebe of BHETC Group and Coppin State University to offer CEU trainings to over 900 therapists, counselors, nurses, and community leaders on <u>human trafficking</u> and <u>trauma-informed care</u>.

Priority Goal and Target #2: To provide access to affordable resources and food.

Improving access to resources is the foundation of what we do. We continue to give back through our annual community support programs.

• Backpacks and supplies to <u>100</u> K-12 students.

- Turkeys and Thanksgiving meals to <u>120</u> families.
- Holiday gifts to <u>286</u> individuals.

Working to decrease the educational gap with an Out of School Time program for the 2021-2022 school year. Funded by Family League.

Growing our after school & summer enrichment program to include coding/machine learning, academic success, and financial literacy. Incorporated as its own nonprofit in 2021.

Increasing our impact through strategic community partnerships for holiday events and raising unrestricted funds.
